"ALTAR CALLS" Gen 12:7

A unique aspect of our church is altar calls: 1. For salvation (appealing to sinners 2. For believers (to respond to the sermon). We need to understand the altar call — and think about how to make them effective if we become Pastors.

I. UNDERSTANDING THE ALTAR

- A. The Bible is filled with the idea of the altar (Place of sacrifice)
 - 1. Very widespread: 433 x mentions of altars
 - a. Noah/Abraham/Isaac/Jacob/Prophets/Kings b. Tabernacle/Temple center of worship c. NT refers to: We have an altar...
 - 2. Spiritual health is connected to altars
 - a. People doing well: Built altars b. Saul: Weak spiritually built 1; Only after a lot of time went by
- B. We need to understand the purpose of the altar
 - 1. The altar always had a physical location: Not just "I talked to God in the woods..."
 - 2. The altar was where people responded to what God has revealed to us
- a. Genesis 12:7 Then the LORD appeared to Abram and said, "To your descendants I will give this land." And there he built an altar to the LORD, who had appeared to him. I see it I agree with what you said
 - 3. The altar was where you met with God: Especially seen in the Temple you came to meet with God
 - 4. The altar was a place of sacrifice: Something died at the altar (OT animals one time Isaac)
- C. For us typically the altar is the space at the front of the church
 - 1. We encourage people to come to the altar after the sermon
 - a. Respond b. Meet with God c. Take care of business repentance

II. CONTENDING FOR THE ALTAR

A. Practical thought #1: In new churches - you must instruct people about the altar

- 1. New converts don't have reference points: They don't know what this is for
 - a. You preach/teach about the altar b. Even personally tell people what to do

B. Practical thought #2: In all churches – you must contend for a supernatural dimension at the altar

- 1. Preaching should aim people to meet with God at the altar
 - a. God can do more in a few minutes of a supernatural encounter than a thousand sermons
- 2. This is giving people the understanding of the personal responsibility to meet with God
 - a. Not genuflection: Supernatural encounter! b. Will cut down the counseling load (healthy people)

C. Practical thought #3: In older churches - you must refresh people's understanding of the altar

- 1. People get into routines: The altar thing... I pop down for a few seconds and I'm off a. No real searching of heart/crying out to God for a miracle/repenting/making vows to God
- 2. So you preach/teach periodically gently remind people that it is not genuflection

III. PRACTICAL THOUGHTS FOR MAKING THE ALTAR EFFECTIVE

A. Some practicals

- 1. Don't re-preach your whole sermon: If you have to say it again you failed the first time!
- 2. Help people to seal things at the altar: Sometimes lead them in a prayer of agreement
- 3. Make the altar a supernatural place of deliverance and encounter
 - a. Pray for deliverance b. Pray for healing c. Pray for breakthroughs d. Pray for habits e. Pray for \$ 1. Sharon Walter: I prayed for healing of broken hearts; God absolutely met with her!
- 4. Have some variety at the altar: Not spiritual just practical; People tune out things that remain the same
 - a. 1 time just let people pray by themselves b. 1 time pray for everyone mass prayer
 - c. Pray for specific needs that were mentioned in the sermon d. Pray for other things not mentioned

 1. In SA: Keith Sullivan very effective revival; Prayed personally for different needs each night
 - e. Mix it up between mass prayer and personally praying for people (this will depend on numbers)
 - f. Sometimes give them a challenge of what they should do after they leave...
- 5. Never underestimate the power of a personal touch: People need a personal touch
 - a. They appreciate it b. It helps their faith c. You can impart a spiritual dimension as headship
 - d. In times of rebellion: I counsel Pastors to make up reasons to lay hands on people
- 1. I Pastored a church in a long season of rebellion/church splits. People would come with a cloud on them: I would have them come to the altar and I would lay hands on them; Something would lift off of them, their minds would come clear so they could make their own decisions about right & wrong.
