Moses: An important lesson is learning contentment: Flows out of service/being hidden/learning to trust God.

**Exodus 2:15-22** <sup>15</sup>When Pharaoh heard of this matter, he sought to kill Moses. But Moses fled from the face of Pharaoh and dwelt in the land of Midian; and he sat down by a well. <sup>16</sup>Now the priest of Midian had seven daughters. And they came and drew water, and they filled the troughs to water their father's flock. <sup>17</sup>Then the shepherds came and drove them away; but Moses stood up and helped them, and watered their flock. <sup>18</sup>When they came to Reuel their father, he said, "How is it that you have come so soon today?" <sup>19</sup>And they said, "An Egyptian delivered us from the hand of the shepherds, and he also drew enough water for us and watered the flock." <sup>20</sup>So he said to his daughters, "And where is he? Why is it that you have left the man? Call him, that he may eat bread." <sup>21</sup>Then Moses was content to live with the man, and he gave Zipporah his daughter to Moses. Lead she bore him a son. He called his name Gershom, for he said, "I have been a stranger in a foreign land."

## I. LEARNING TO SERVE

- A. Sometimes we can have a high opinion of ourselves
  - 1. Moses was raised in a palace: Best education/wealth/attention
    - a. Some scholars feel he was a military hero
  - 2. So the idea of God having plans for our lives we think in terms of attention
    - a. I will star for God! I will be on the platform/with a microphone/having a title...
  - 3. These attitudes always cause problems
    - a. Conflict with others/making bad decisions (murder!)/harming the cause of God
- B. God uses the conflicts/problems to teach us to humble us
  - 1. Moses runs away to the desert of Midian and winds up with a shepherd
    - a. Genesis 46:34 shepherds are detestable to the Egyptians; Low-class/despised/unimportant
      - 1. Moses winds up being a shepherd working for someone else
  - 2. Moses learned to serve: He was serving someone else's interests
    - a. That is often the starting point of usefulness
- 1. **Mark 9:35** <sup>35</sup>Jesus sat down and called the twelve apostles to him. He said, "Whoever wants to be the most important must be last of all and servant of all."
  - 3. Service is putting your interests lower/later than the interests of others or of the ministry/church
    - a. Getting work done to bless others
      - 1. Luke 16:12 And if you have not been faithful in what is another man's, who will give you what is your own?
  - 4. You cannot have your own destiny unless you can serve other people's

## II. LEARNING TO BE HIDDEN

- A. Moses came from Egypt: The capitol/the palace; People would have seen him/probably bowed to him
- 1. He is in the back of the desert Exodus 3:1 Now Moses was tending the flock of Jethro his father-in-law, the priest of Midian. And he led the flock to the back of the desert, and came to Horeb, the mountain of God.
  - a. The middle of nowhere: No one knows that he is serving his father-in-law!
  - 2. The hiddenness of destiny is often the struggle
    - a. If there were public announcements ladies and gentlemen! Moses is humbly/fantastically serving
  - 3. For disciples it is difficult to be hidden: To do right when no one knows it
    - a. Every disciple must be hidden in order to develop/enter destiny
- b. **Isaiah 49:2** <sup>2</sup>He made my mouth like a sharpened sword, in the shadow of his hand he hid me; he made me into a polished arrow and concealed me in his quiver.
  - 4. This is where we learn humility this is where we learn to trust
    - a. Can you do right if you are hidden? b. You pray no one knows. Witness/give/help...
      - 1. **V22** And she bore him a son. He called his name Gershom, for he said, "I have been a stranger in a foreign land."

## **III. LEARNING TO TRUST**

- A. The story of Moses serving while being hidden ends with the story of God at work
- 1. **Exodus 2:24–25** <sup>24</sup>God heard their groaning and he remembered his covenant with Abraham, with Isaac and with Jacob. <sup>25</sup>So God looked on the Israelites and was concerned about them.
  - a. God was doing things that Moses knew nothing about
  - b. God is working in you things that you may not realize how powerful they are
  - c. God is working for you preparing circumstances for your destiny to be revealed
  - 2. God sees where you're at! God knows what you are doing!
    - a. So Trust God! He knows where you're at and will speak to us at the right time
